## **Delivery Options**

When teaching in a <u>Hybrid Learning Space (CATS)</u> it is possible to access Blackboard Collaborate (BBC), via the Moodle quick link, on the lectern computer, after your initial login. It is recommended that a secondary device be used, where you login to the same Blackboard Collaborate meeting as a Guest. From the lectern computer, share your presentation and from your secondary device, ensure that the **Chat** panel is visible. Having the two logins allows you to focus on the presentation and be able to monitor the chat separately.





## Recording your BBC class session

When you start your BBC session, you will be prompted to connect with the audio and video of the computer. When using the lectern computer, please select:

- > Audio: CODEC or Dante
- > Video: USB Capture SDI+

With microphone and camera now setup, you will be prompted to record the session. The in-room camera image for the online students will be quite compressed, with less clarity than other streaming platforms e.g., Lecture Recordings+, Zoom.

When sharing your screen, a PowerPoint presentation or using the whiteboard, the in-room camera view will appear as a very small image in the corner of the student's screen.
